Department of Human Services Director Lillian Koller and the University of Hawaii's School of Nursing and Dental Hygiene Dean Mary Boland are pleased to sponsor the following visiting scholars program to help address the health needs of vulnerable, at-risk children. These scholars and consultants bring an expertise in child health services, social services, pediatric nursing, and program evaluation.

The Child Health Program (CHP) of the François-Xavier Bagnoud Center at the University of Medicine & Dentistry (UMDNJ) of New Jersey is a collaboration with the New Jersey State Department of Children and Families and the School of Nursing at UMDNJ.

The goal of the Child Health Program is to ensure that the healthcare needs of vulnerable, at-risk children are met. CHP provides a range of community-based, family and pediatric nursing services including collaboration with the State Department of Children and Families child welfare professionals to effectively address the health needs of targeted child and family client and providing, coordinating and supervising pediatric nursing services.

ABOUT THE VISITING CONSULTANTS & SCHOLARS

- **Nina B. Colabelli, RN, MSN, CPNP, Director, Child Health Program, FXB Center.** Nina B. Colabelli has been the Director of the Child Health Program at the UMDNJ since 2003. As the Director, Ms. Colabelli is primarily responsible for the general administrative oversight and coordination of services for the CHP. She directs and supervises the activities of Advance Practice Nurses and nurses out-posted in the Division of Youth and Family Services' Local Offices in fourteen of the twenty one counties in the state of New Jersey. Ms. Colabelli is a Clinical Associate Professor of Pediatrics at the UMDNJ and is the author of several publications. Her community service work includes APN nursing expertise to Apostle's House Initiative, a congregational care setting in Newark, New Jersey, for adolescent mothers and their babies, and serving as a member of the Community Emergency Response Team in Aberdeen, New Jersey.

- **Deborah S. Storm, PhD, RN, Director, Research and Evaluation, FXB Center.** Dr. Storm directs programmatic research and evaluation at the François-Xavier Bagnoud Center at the UMDNJ and is a Clinical Associate Professor in the School of Nursing. Dr. Storm provides leadership for evaluation and research related to FXB Center programs including Health Care Connections, a community outreach program; the Child Health Program, which provides specialized nursing services for New Jersey's Child Welfare Agency; FXB Center HIV/AIDS National Resource Center; and the CDC-Global AIDS Program University Technical Assistance Project, and the FXB-PACTG (IMPAACT) Global Training Program.
- **Constance M. Ryan, CSW, Consultant to Child Health Program, FXB Center.** Ms. Ryan is a private consultant concentrating in the areas of child health, child welfare, education and training. Her professional experiences have included direct practice, administration, program and policy development, faculty with the Family Life Development Center at Cornell University and Director of the Medical Unit, Division of Youth and Family Services. As a lead trainer with Cornell's Child Protective Services Training Institute, she co-authored several training curricula developed for new and *on-the-job* child welfare professionals, and delivered training both locally and nationally. In 1995, she was recognized by the Child Welfare League of America with the first *J. Burt Annin Award for Community Service* for work on behalf of children and families affected by HIV/AIDS. She has facilitated numerous workshops, and is the co-author and editor of publications produced by the Child Welfare League of America.

PURPOSE

Hosted by *Hui Ola Pono*, a project funded by the Department of Human Services in collaboration with the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa School of Nursing and Dental Hygiene, to promote the efficiency and effectiveness of the State of Hawai'i's Medicaid Program, the consultants and scholars will:

1. Provide strategic planning to the Hui Ola Pono project team and Department of Human Services on child welfare services with a focus on the development of a family health training and resource center including but not limited to:
 - a) need for child health service programs in Hawai'i
 - b) program model(s) for Hawai'i
 - c) quality assurance and evaluation components for child health programs
 - d) bridge between social services and nursing services for children
2. Provide guest presentation(s) to the community including an overview of the CHP program and areas contributing to health services of vulnerable, at-risk children;
3. Provide a guest presentation to university faculty, staff and students on areas of training, research and other interests related to child health and pediatric nursing services; and
4. Provide consultation to interested community members and faculty regarding child health programs for vulnerable populations (if schedule permits).

Meetings, presentations, and visits will be held in the community, at the University campus, and various state offices including site visits to community health care sites serving children and families.
